

How To Attain Jesus' Standard of Greatness Matthew 20: 20-28 (NIV)



Matthew 20:20-28 (NIV)

²⁰ Then the mother of Zebedee's sons came to Jesus with her sons and, kneeling down, asked a favor of him... 24 When the ten heard about this, they were indignant with the two brothers. ²⁵ Jesus called them together and said, "You know that the rulers of the Gentiles lord it over them, and their high officials exercise authority over them. ²⁶ Not so with you. Instead, whoever wants to become great among you must be your servant, ²⁷ and whoever wants to be first must be your slave— ²⁸ just as the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many."

3 Mindsets to Attain Jesus' Standard of Greatness

- 1. Approach the world as Jesus approached it: By His Holy standard (v24-25)
- 2. Make the same contribution as Jesus made it: Through His humble Service (v26-27)
- 3. Seek the same goal as Jesus sought: He laid down His life as a human sacrifice (v28)



1. Approach the world as Jesus approached it: By His Holy standard (v24-25)

- 1. Christ's way is in total opposition to the ways of the world
- 2. Christ's way of leadership is through servitude not subjugation
 - Loving versus lording
 - Seek God's glory rather than personal glory
 - Worldly versus Christ-centred leadership pattern
- 3. To pursue greatness one must pursue God's holy standard

2. Make the same contribution as Jesus made: Through His humble service (v26-27)

- 1. Humble men of the Old Testament (Heb. 11)
- 2. The ultimate humble man: Jesus Christ (Phil. 2:6-11)

 Who, being in very nature God,

 did not consider equality with God something to be grasped,
 but made himself nothing, taking the very nature of a servant,
 being made in human likeness.

 And being found in appearance as a man, he humbled himself
- 3. In order to pursue greatness one must pursue humility.


and became obedient to death - even death on a cross!



3. Seek the same goal as Jesus sought: Gave His Life as a human sacrifice (v28)

- 'Servant', 'slave', 'served', 'serve': hard, unappreciated, menial service, beyond one's comfort zone
- "If we live, we live for the Lord; and if we die, we die to the Lord. So whether we live or die, we belong to the Lord." (Rom. 14:8)
- "Death is at work in us, but life is at work in you."
 (2 Cor. 4:12)
 Paul suffered so that the Corinthians may experience the life-giving power and presence of Christ!
- Suffering: affliction, persecution, perplexity, etc loneliness, weariness, criticism






Suffering: weariness & criticism

"I never met a man who was abandoned to the cause of God who wasn't tired or weary. Or a woman. And criticism is another part of the pain. You can expect to be misunderstood, misrepresented, misjudged, wrongly evaluated, accused. And to handle that without selfdefense, without selfjustification means that you bear the burden between you and the Lord and perhaps someone close and dear to you."



Solutions to overcome the Pitfalls

- 1. Wait on the Lord... (Isa. 40:28-31)
- 2. Look to the Cross remembering what the Lord Jesus has done for you (Jn. 3:16; Rom. 5:8; Gal. 2:20)
- 3. Boldly claim God's promises (e.g. John 14:12)
- 4. Be encouraged by the reward you will receive from the Lord (2 Tim. 4:8)
