Therefore I tell you, whatever you ask for in prayer, believe that you have received it, and it will be yours.


And when you stand praying, if you hold anything against anyone, forgive them, so that your Father in heaven may forgive you your sins."

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Lessons about our life in God, and the Church

1. Don't have leaves without fruit

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Let no foreigner who is bound to the LORD say, "The LORD will surely exclude me from his people." And let no eunuch complain, "I am only a dry tree." For this is what the LORD says: "To the eunuchs who keep my Sabbaths, who choose what pleases me and hold fast to my covenant to them I will give within my temple and its walls a memorial and a name better than sons and daughters; I will give them an everlasting name that will endure forever. ls 56:3-5

And foreigners who bind themselves to the LORD to minister to him, to love the name of the LORD, and to be his servants, all who keep the Sabbath without desecrating it and who hold fast to my covenant—these I will bring to my holy mountain and give them joy in my house of prayer.

Their burnt offerings and sacrifices will be accepted on my altar; for my house will be called a house of prayer for all nations.

Deut 23:1

No one who has been emasculated by crushing or cutting may enter the assembly of the LORD.

Foreigner

Deut 23:3

No Ammonite or Moabite or any of their descendants may enter the assembly of the LORD, not even in the tenth generation.

On this mountain the LORD Almighty will prepare a feast of rich food for all peoples, a banquet of aged wine the best of meats and the finest of wines. On this mountain he will destroy the shroud that enfolds all peoples, the sheet that covers all nations; he will swallow up death forever. "With respect to the eunuch, the purpose of the prohibition is clearly to teach the goodness of nature as we find it in creation. Sexuality is a good part of God's creation, and while we are not to worship it, neither are we to condone its destruction"

"We must not forget that actions have consequences, especially when those actions are in opposition to God's plan to bring his salvation into the world. But again, once the point has been made, a greater point can take precedence: God intends to "make a feast for all peoples" in which "the covering that is cast over the peoples" will be destroyed (25:6–7). And "all peoples" includes even Ammonites and Moabites; they will not be cut off by God."

"Don't be fooled into thinking that you will never suffer because the Temple is here. It's a lie! Do you really think you can steal, murder, commit adultery, lie, and burn incense to Baal and all those other new gods of yours, and then come here and stand before me in my Temple and chant, "We are safe!"—only to go right back to all those evils again? Don't you yourselves admit that this Temple, which bears my name, has become a den of thieves? Surely I see all the evil going on there. I, the LORD, have spoken!

Jer 7:8-11

"They flee to the temple for protection, thinking to be safe there, believing that participation in the formal rituals of the cult would somehow deliver them from the Judge. But the temple was no sheltering place for covenant-breakers. There was no security there from the searching eyes of Yahweh."

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



- 5.Is our Faith and Allegience to God alone? Do we believe He can move all obstacles for growth in our lives and in our church? Do we forgive as He forgives?


