A message of Psalm 85

PSALM 85 (NIV 1984)

¹ You showed favour to your land, O LORD; you restored the fortunes of Jacob.
² You forgave the iniquity of your people and covered all their sins. *Selah*³ You set aside all your wrath and turned from your fierce anger.

PSALM 85

⁴Restore us again, O God our Savior, and put away your displeasure toward us. ⁵ Will you be angry with us forever? Will you prolong your anger through all generations? ⁶ Will you not revive us again, that your people may rejoice in you? ⁷ Show us your unfailing love, O LORD, and grant us your salvation.

PSALM 85

⁸ I will listen to what God the LORD will say; he promises peace to his people, his saints but let them not return to folly. ⁹ Surely his salvation is near those who fear him, that his glory may dwell in our land. ¹⁰ Love and faithfulness meet together; righteousness and peace kiss each other.

PSALM 85

¹¹ Faithfulness springs forth from the earth, and righteousness looks down from heaven.
¹² The LORD will indeed give what is good, and our land will yield its harvest.
¹³ Righteousness goes before him and prepares the way for his steps.

I. REMEMBER GOD'S PAST FAITHFULNESS

- a. Past Mercies Recognized Psalm 85:2
- b. Past Movements Revered Psalm 85:3
- Hebrew: 'nāśā"- forgave- to lift or carry away
- Application:
 - i. Journal God's faithfulness (steadfast love)
 - ii. Recall God's faithfulness
 - iii. Sing of God's faithfulness

II. REPENT OF PRESENT FAILURES a. Confession is Crucial – Psalm 85:5 b. Contrition is Commanded – Psalm 85:7 • Hebrew: 'šûb' – 'repent'- to return

- Application:
 - i. Engage in daily confession.(Use Psalm 139:3-4 as guide).
 - ii. Exercise the 6 R's of biblical repentance.

THE 6 R'S OF BIBLICAL REPENTANCE

1. Recognize – See the Sin Clearly (Psalm 51:3)

- Acknowledge the *specific* sin without excuse or blame-shifting.
- Application: Ask God to reveal any area of disobedience through prayer and His Word.

2. Regret – Feel Godly Sorrow (2 Cor. 7:10)

- Experience genuine sorrow, not just guilt or fear of consequences.
- Application: Let your heart break over what breaks God's heart.

THE 6 R'S OF BIBLICAL REPENTANCE

- 3. Repent Turn Away from Sin (Acts 3:19)
- Make a decisive change in direction—turn from sin and turn toward God.
- Application: Confess your sin to God and choose to forsake it.

4. Receive – Accept God's Forgiveness (1 Jn 1:9)

- Believe in God's promise to forgive when we truly repent.
- Application: Don't live in shame—receive His grace with gratitude.

THE 6 R'S OF BIBLICAL REPENTANCE

5. Renew – Walk in Obedience (Romans 12:2)

- Replace sinful patterns with godly habits; pursue holiness.
- Application: Cultivate a renewed lifestyle through prayer, Scripture, and community.

6. Reconcile- Restore Relationships (2 Cor. 5:18-19)

- Take responsibility for your wrong.
- Application: Say "Sorry". Forgive one another (Col. 3:13).

III. RECEIVE GOD'S PROMISED FUTURE

a. Peace Promised – Psalm 85:8

- b. Presence Provided Psalm 85:9
- c. Prosperity Proclaimed Psalm 85:13
- Hebrew: 'šālóm' 'peace' wholeness, wellbeing, harmony (see Romans 3:25-26)
- Application:
 - i. Listen daily for God's voice, through His Word, prayer and silence
 - ii. Claim God's promises; walk in hopeful anticipation

ROMANS 3:25-26

presented him as a sacrifice "God of atonement, through faith in his blood. He did this to demonstrate his justice, because in his forbearance he had left the sins committed beforehand unpunished-- he did it to demonstrate his justice at the present time, so as to be just and the one who justifies those who have faith in Jesus."


